Winter Retreat in Gatlinburg

Our youth recently returned from an incredible Winter Retreat in Gatlinburg, where we experienced both adventure and spiritual growth. A group of 17 stayed at the Smoky Mountain Resort Ministry house, enjoying a weekend filled with fellowship, fun, and faith. We played games, bowled, and played basketball at the Gatlinburg Community Center, explored downtown, and ate some great meals together. One of the highlights of the retreat was our devotional time, where we traced **the mountain top experiences and challenges in the ministry of Jesus**—from His temptation by Satan on the mountain (Matthew 4), to the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), the Transfiguration (Matthew 17), and ultimately to the Great Commission on the mountain at the end of the book of Matthew (Matthew 28:16-20). We reflected on how these moments shaped Jesus' mission and how God meets us in both the high moments and the challenges of our faith journey. Originally planning to visit Ober Gatlinburg, a power outage led us to an unexpected blessing: a thrilling snow tubing experience in Pigeon Forge. It was a weekend full of laughter, bonding, and growing in our faith together!
